Single presenters will be grouped into 80 minute sessions with three single presenters on related topics.  Presenters will have a computer, microphone, and screen to display powerpoint and other visual materials.	All talks are required to choose the category for which their presentation is best aligned with:  Research: presenting original data and analysis from surveys, experiments, or other methods  Teaching: matters of pedagogical practices, curricula, student engagement in the classroom, course design, or other pedagogical practices and insights.  Theory and ideas: analysis of available data, persuasive arguments, theoretical frameworks, or original ideas.  Symposia submissions should explain the overarching theme of the symposium and how each presentation contributes to the theme.  Presenters will have a computer, microphone, and screen to display powerpoint and other visual materials.	Panel discussions will feature 3-4 presenters sitting in chairs having a discussion on a topic related to the conference theme or HxA's mission.  We strongly recommend one of the four presenters serves as the moderator of the session to pose questions to panelists, keep the conversation on topic, and facilitate Q&A from the audience.  Panel presenters will each be provided with a chair and microphone. No computers or presentations will be shown for panel discussions.	Workshops should be designed to provide attendees with practical advice, tools, and experiences to facilitate professional development.  Workshops should provide participants with the opportunity to engage with experts, partake in dynamic discussions, and/or collaborate in hands-on activities that will equip them with skills that can be implemented in their academic and professional roles.  Workshop rooms will be equipped with a computer, microphone, and screen to display powerpoint and other visual materials. Rooms will also have tables for attendees to work at collaboratively with other attendees.	Heterodox Conversations™ are signature HxA events that pair two scholarly experts with divergent viewpoints on a topic. These events showcase the power of academic dialogue and constructive disagreement in the shared pursuit of knowledge. Heterodox Conversations™ should be framed as a question that invites nuanced perspectives without a clear yes or no answer and should not be framed as a debate.  You can see an example of these events here. Heterodox Conversations™ must follow the below format:  1. Speaker Presentations Each speaker has 15 minutes to present their scholarship on the topic.  2. Speaker Conversation (20 minute total): Speakers engage in dialogue with each other about their work.  3. Audience Q&A (30 minutes): The audience is invited to pose questions and comments for the speakers.  We recommend each session have a moderator/host to keep time, introduce speakers, and help keep the session on track through each phase.  Rooms will be equipped with a computer, microphones, and screen to display powerpoint and other visual materials. Rooms will also have two chairs available for presenters to use while engaging in their conversation.
